Sensory Integration at a Glance • Theory: Vestibular and proprioception are key sensations in development and function (Kuhaneck & Watling, 2010)
• The exteroceptive system alone is not enough! • Multisensory approach allows for cortical growth and learning • The right amount of the right input to maintain an optimal “level of arousal”

...sensory integration theory assumes that the brain is immature at birth and also is immature [or dysfunctional] in some individuals with learning problems The goal of sensory integration therapy is to provide stimulation that will address certain brain levels (primarily subcortical), enabling them to mature [or function more normally], and

Sensory Processing Disorder

Sensory Processing Disorder Red Flags Preschool 3-4 years Sensory Processing Disorder (SPD) can affect one sense or multiple senses Symptoms vary for children who have SPD Consider the child’s behavior over the last several weeks If you recognize several symptoms in a child, screening for SPD may be warranted

ACTIVITIES TO PROVIDE SENSORY INPUT

Sensory processing deficits can be divided into four categories: 1 Sensory defensiveness is the inability to correctly interpret and respond to incoming information An individual with sensory defensiveness responds to benign sensory input as if it was threatening and demonstrates unusual responses or behaviors that are difficult to manage
